



Make a Rhyme

Encourage children to create sounds or words that rhyme. It's okay if they aren't real words, this is a chance for children to have fun and explore sounds in words. Children will fill in the missing rhyme.

For example:

The cat had a...hat. (bat, zat, mat...)

The bear had a...chair. (hair, flair, blare)

A bug in a ...rug. (mug, wug, chug...)

A tree with a...flea. (key, bee, chee...)

Prompt Children to Identify or Manipulate Various Units of Sound

“That’s right, zat does rhyme with cat! You put /z/ with /at/ and made a funny word that rhymes. Good rhyming!”
