Transition Tunes

Make up silly rhymes as part of transition routines. This builds children's natural interest in rhymes while moving from one part of the day to the next.

> Let's line up at the door. Tip toe tip toe on the floor. We are going outside to play. Hip hip hooray.

Wipe the table down. So we don't frown. Our bellies are ready to eat. What a special treat.

More Support: Use exaggerated stress and silly voices to emphasize rhyming words. Act out the movements.

Stress the Rime Ending of Rhyming Words

"'Let's line up at the *door*. Tip toe tip toe on the *floor*.' Did you hear the rhyming words? They both end in –or. Door and floor both sound the same at the end."
