



Opposite Hunt

Look for opposites all around! Draw or describe a new or unfamiliar word or object. Help children think about what its opposite may be. Encourage them to look around the room to find or show you the opposite. For example, if you introduced the word *underneath*, they would show you something *above*. Remember to encourage children to share words from their home language.

Draw Attention to Word Relations

“I have this humongous ball. That means it is REALLY big. What could we find that would be the opposite of humongous?”

“I have a picture of person who is grinning. That means they are smiling. Can you show me what the opposite of grinning would look like?”
