



Shape & Color Hunt

Challenge children to hunt for certain shapes or colors in your learning environment (inside or outside). When needed, provide additional support with a visual example. For example, show a circle, then prompt children to find a shape that is the same as that one. Consider having children move to touch the object they find, if possible. Add challenge by combining shape and color (e.g., a blue circle).

More Support: Cut out shapes and put them around the room, in addition to the shapes found in everyday life. Label the shapes throughout the day.
