



Hopscotch

Draw a simple hopscotch board with chalk (1-5 or 1-10). Challenge children to toss a rock or bean bag and then count/hop to the square where it lands. Since there is only one board, children will have to wait for their turn. Help them wait by providing an alternative activity (e.g., counting along, clapping or stomping the number in place, showing the number using fingers).

Model One-To-One Correspondence

“(Child) landed on the number 4. Let’s stomp our foot four times while they jump! 1-2-3-4
(count as you stomp)!”

“Your beanbag landed on the number 7. Let’s show 7 with our fingers and count them! Now, count your fingers *(touch each finger as you count).*”
