

Exploration Bins

In a basket, box, or bag, collect 5-6 items according to a theme/topic for children to freely explore.

Allow children to play freely with the items, to ask questions, and to take their time interacting with the materials however they choose.

Examples:

- Color: collect red items, such as a toy tomato, toy firetruck, red crayon, toy crab, and red ball
- Music: maracas, egg shakers, chimes, jingle bell strips, and drumsticks
- Insects: toy centipede, spider, ladybug, bumblebee, and dragonfly

More Support: If you notice children becoming frustrated while trying to explore how items work, provide gentle guidance or model and narrate how to use the item. Give children space to explore.
